country	país	Spain is my country. / What country are you from?
city	ciudad	I live in a big city. / Madrid is a city.
school	colegio	My school is near my house. / I go to school every day.
student	estudiante	I am a student. / Are you a student?
like	gustar	I like music. / I don't like football. / Do you like music?
favorite	favorito/a	My favorite color is blue. / What is your favorite color?

VOCABULARIO 2 — FAMILY & PEOPLE

family	familia	My family is big. / I love my family.
mother	madre	My mother is a teacher. / This is my mother.
father	padre	My father works in Madrid. / This is my father.
brother	hermano	I have one brother. / My brother is twelve.
sister	hermana	I have two sisters. / My sister likes music.
parents	padres	My parents are at home. / I live with my parents.
friend	amigo/a	Emma is my friend. / I have many friends.
boy	chico	The boy is my brother. / The boy is twelve.
girl	chica	The girl is my sister. / The girl is very happy.
person	persona	She is a nice person. / He is a funny person.

VOCABULARIO 3 — HOME

Word	Español	Examples
home	hogar/casa	I am at home. / My home is small.
house	casa	I live in a house. / My house is big.
room	habitación	This is my room. / My room is small.
bedroom	dormitorio	My bedroom is upstairs. / I sleep in my bedroom.
kitchen	cocina	My mother is in the kitchen. / The kitchen is big.
bathroom	baño	The bathroom is next to my bedroom. / I am in the bathroom.
living room	salón	We watch TV in the living room. / The living room is big.
bed	cama	My bed is comfortable. / The cat is on my bed.
table	mesa	The book is on the table. / The table is in the kitchen.
door	puerta	The door is open. / Close the door, please.

Word	Español	Examples
teacher	profesor/a	My teacher is nice. / The teacher is in the classroom.
classmate	compañero/a de clase	Tom is my classmate. / I have many classmates.
classroom	aula	We are in the classroom. / The classroom is big.
lesson	clase/lección	The English lesson starts at nine. / I like the English lesson.
book	libro	I have an English book. / My book is on the table.
homework	deberes	I have homework today. / I do my homework after school.
study	estudiar	I study English. / I don't study at night. / Do you study English?
go	ir	I go to school every day. / I don't go to school on Sundays. / Do you go to school by bus?
get up	levantarse	I get up at seven. / I don't get up late. / What time do you get up?
have breakfast	desayunar	I have breakfast at seven. / I don't have breakfast at school. / Do you have breakfast at home?
